Subject: Study to support the Commission's Policy Development on Liability for Artificial Intelligence

I hereby confirm that Deloitte and Timelex (hereinafter the consortium) are currently under contract with the European Commission, Directorate-General for Justice and Consumers (DG JUST), to undertake a study to support the Commission's policy development on liability for artificial intelligence (outside of product liability).

The study's aim is to support the Commission in collecting evidence on how the present and probable future challenges of AI to the national civil liability frameworks and possible adaptations at national level affect business active in the EU, as well as on the impact of possible solutions that could be introduced at EU level.

The study will focus on:

- An economic analysis for AI-solutions in the EU
- Assess the victim's cost of obtaining due compensation for damage caused by AI
- Assess whether and to what extent businesses are uncertain about national civil liberty rules applicable to damage caused by AI
- Assess the costs of fragmentation of laws for civil liability for AI

- Estimate the costs and benefits of specific measures
- Assess how AI-solutions could be insured
- Estimate the costs and benefits of different possible EU initiatives
